Municipal solid waste (MSW) — Tourist arrivals in hotels and similar accommodation





Fællesskab for ideudvikling under projektet URBANWASTE

Velkommen til fællesskab for ideudvikling under projektet URBANWASTE, som er finansieret under den Europæiske Unions program for forskning og innovation, Horizon 2020, finansieringsaftale nr. 690452-2.

Hvordan kan vi få en renere by? Hver dag genereres affald fra de aktiviteter, der er i byen. Især over sommeren hvor hele byen summer af liv, både fra indbyggere og turister fra ind- og udland. Københavns kommune deltager sammen med 10 andre byer i projektet URBANWASTE for at sætte fokus på affald fra turisme. Hvordan kan vi forebygge affald eller behandle det mere miljørigtigt?

Ideen med et fællesskab for ideudvikling er at samle interesserede, der har input til en renere og mere bæredygtig by. Det kan være eksperter fra turistbranchen, affaldsbranchen og NGOer, såvel som borgere, der vil bidrage til nye løsninger for en by med mindre affald, mere genanvendelse og bedre udnyttelse af ressourcer. I hver af de 11 byer, som deltager i projektet, laves fællesskaber for idegenerering af innovative løsninger, der kan styrke bæredygtigheden inden for turisme i byerne. Alle ideer deles mellem byerne, så arbejdet kommer flere byer til gode.

Formålet med denne side er at dele viden om udfordringer og løsninger på affaldsområdet i relation til turisme i København. Derudover vil der være information om de arrangementer, som finder sted. Alle er inviteret til at deltage og bidrage, så København kan blive en renere by, både for københavnerne og for de mange turister, som besøger byen.

Tourist behaviours

- Different behaviours during vacations
- Discrepencies between "attitude" and "behaviours":
 - Change of behaviours when travelling
 - Waste infrastructures at home / in vacations + gap
- Women more likely to be responsible of domestic waste handling
- Little correlations between behaviours and sociodemographic parameters
