




THE LEGAL WASTE ISSUE












Implementation and enforcement of EU waste law remain poor:

- → Missing / inadequate infrastructure, heavy reliance on landfilling
- Waste not collected separately
- Illegal shipments of waste
- → Thousands illegal landfills
- → ELV and packaging waste targets not met
- → Still high risk of damage to health and safety
- → No societal habits of eco-consumption
- → Frequent infringement cases






Environment: infringement cases by sector (June 2011)



Cases per Member State - June 20, 2011








NEW WASTE FRAMEWORK DIRECTIVE/ Objectives, Simplification, Clarification

- New environmental objective;
- More precise scope;
- Incorporation of other legislation:
 - → Hazardous Waste (all existing requirements + new provisions)
 - → Waste Oils (no absolute priority for regeneration, requirement for separate collection)
- Clarification & streamlining of definitions (recycling, recovery, waste: end-of-waste and by-products)







Waste management hierarchy







Turning waste prevention into reality

- Member States to establish waste prevention programmes by 2013
 - set out prevention objectives,
 - determine qualitative and quantitative benchmarks or targets for waste prevention,
 - describe prevention measures, such as
 - Economic instruments for sustainable resource use
 - Promotion of eco-design for products
 - Campaigns to change consumer behaviour
 - Supporting the reduction of industrial waste (EMAS, ISO 14001)
 - Green public procurement





Waste prevention – further steps from EC

- → Development of waste prevention indicators
- → Establishment of a system for sharing information on best practice regarding waste prevention
- → Development of prevention guidelines for Member States
- 2011: Commission report on the evolution of waste generation and waste prevention
- 2014: Commission to propose waste prevention and decoupling objectives by 2020, if appropriate






Moving up the waste hierarchy Recycling

- WFD targets to be achieved by 2020
 - → preparation for re-use, recycling of municipal waste, at least paper, metal, plastic, glass from households, to a minimum of overall 50%
 - preparation for re-use, recycling and backfilling of 70% construction & demolition waste
- Commission is preparing a decision on the calculation of the targets
- Challenge for European Member States?

Moving up the waste hierarchy Separate collection of waste

Waste Framework Directive

- → separate collection at least of paper, metal, plastic, glass by 2015
- separate collection of bio-waste (composting and digestion)
- separate collection of waste oils
- ban on mixing of hazardous waste







Moving up the waste hierarchy Promoting waste-to-energy

- Energy efficiency thresholds for Municipal Waste Incinerators
 - → 0.60 for installations in operation before 2009
 - → 0.65 for new installations
- Incentive to improve energy-use from waste incineration
 - Challenge for
 - Incinerators in southern EU countries
 - Incinerators selling only electricity
- Commissions is finalising guidelines
- Mandate to introduce a climate correction factor



Resource-efficiency Roadmap

- Adopted on 20 September 2011
- Time Horizon
 - → Vision 2050
 - → Objectives 2020
 - → Short term objectives
- Overall objective: making Europe Resource efficient





Waste as Resource

- 2020 aspirational objectives
 - → Full implementation of the EU waste acquis -Eradicate illegal shipment of waste
 - → Waste generation per capita in decline
 - → Recycling and reuse are economically attractive
 - → Energy recovery limited to non-recyclable materials
 - → Landfilling virtually eliminated





Waste as Resource – In practice

- Waste management
 - → New target for waste prevention to be considered by 2020
 - Review of existing reuse and recycling targets to be raised to their maximum feasible level by 2014
 - → Review of the landfill diversion target by 2014
- Other supportive measures
 - → EU public funding aligned with waste hierarchy
 - → Improve coherence of the EU legislation
 - Product policy (boost material efficiency in ecodesign reusability, recyclability, recycled content, durability)
 - Measures to extent the producer responsibility (through guidance on take back and recycling schemes)





EU 2020 and Waste Management

More prevention, reuse and recycling means:

- Job Creation skilled or not potential for 0.5 to 0.7 Millions jobs
- Access to Raw material from few percent to significant contribution
- Increase competitiveness of EU Industry excellence of the EU recycling industry
- Increase Resource Efficiency contribution to resource productivity
- Reduce GHG Emissions between 19 to 31% of the 2020 target
- Boost innovation critical/impacting raw materials

In summary a perfect contribution to the EU 2020 strategy!

- Smart, sustainable and inclusive growth
- In line with:
 - ➤ EU 2020 Targets on employment, innovation and climate change/energy, indirectly to the 2 others (education and poverty/social exclusion)
 - → And several Flagships Resource efficiency, Industrial Policy, Innovation, new skills and jobs
